The clue is always written in the same part of the speech as the answer. Check for clues that require answers that end with S, ED, EST, or ING. Often these endings can be penciled (but not always). Checking these answer cruisers can help verify that the end is valid. For example, if both over and below the clue is in the plural of two responses that exceed the last letter, it is likely that the letter is S. Foreign words are marked directly: Friend: Fr. = AMI or, indirectly, Friend, France. Abbreviated responses are marked directly, Whistlestop (L.) = STA or indirectly abbreviated word as part of a clue, RR stop = STA. Liverpool journalist Arthur Wynne invented the first crossword puzzle. Arthur Wynne was born on April 22, 1925, in New He emigrated to the United States at the age of 19. He first lived in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and worked for the Pittsburgh Press. An interesting side note was that Wynne also played the violin with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra. Arthur Wynne later moved to Cedar Grove, New Jersey, and began working for new york-based newspaper New York World. He wrote the first crossword puzzle for New York World, published on Sunday, December 21, 1913. The editor had asked Wynne to invent a new game paper for Sunday's entertainment section. Arthur Wynne's first crossword puzzle was originally called a word-cross and was diamond-shaped. The name later went into the crossword puzzle, and then as a result of a random typo hyphen fell and the name became a crossword puzzle. Wynne based his crossword puzzle on a similar but much older game played in the old Pompeii that translated into Latin English called Magic Squares. In Magic Squares, the player is given a group of words and has to arrange them on the grid so that the words read log over and below. The crossword puzzle is very similar, except instead of giving words to the player is given hints. Arthur Wynne added other innovations to the crossword puzzle. Although the first puzzle was diamond-shaped, he later invented horizontal and vertical shaped puzzles; and Wynne invented the use of adding an empty black square crossword puzzle. The crossword puzzle in the British edition was published in Pearson's Magazine in February 1922. First New York On 1 February 1930, the Commission adopted a directive on the use of the european According to the Guinness Book of Records, in 1924, the World Record was published. Called Cross Word Puzzle Book was the first publication of a new partnership formed by Dick Simon and Lincoln Schuster. The book, the compilation of crossword puzzles from the newspaper New York World, was an instant success and helped create publishing giant Simon & Schuster, who continue to produce crossword books to this day. In 1997, Crossword Weaver patented Variety Games Inc.'s Crossword Weaver was the first computer software program that created crossword puzzles. Puzzles.
